Arguably, the man who best represents English Romanticism is perhaps William Wordsworth. He saw nature with new eyes, and his whole work is an attempt to communicate that new vision. In his youth he had been a strong supporter of the French Revolution, but later he gave up his political ideas to devote himself entirely to the task of bringing to the world beauty and happiness.

Wordsworth held that in cultivation of sensibility and imagination, one would be able to find great sources of healthy enjoyment and delight. To prove his idea, he relied on his own experience. In his works Wordsworth described how he, once **overwhelmed** by unhappiness, could again find comfort and love and recover his peace of mind, and he employed very simple daily language to demonstrate his idea of true art, "the spontaneous overflow of powerful feelings, recollected in tranquility."

Hailed as "king of animals," lions have long been honored and respected by humans for its beauty, power and seeming courage. The truth behind the story, however, may disappoint many. It seems that lions are not so courageous after all: they usually choose the weakest prey and attack from behind. As to the myth of power? Well, four out of five times their hunting ends in failure. What's worse, the males tend to steal the kill of the females. The large build of the body makes it difficult for the male lions to run for long, and they roughly spend 20 hours a day sleeping. Their persistence in spite of the high failure rate, however, is **something else**. Due to the difference in habitats, it's impossible to see lions and tigers being put together like in the fables in the natural environment. However, if there were to be a fight between these two species, tigers might have the upper hand due to their enormous size and super strong forelimbs. Tigers are also very skillful swimmers – the only exception in the cat family!

Have you ever seen this word "serendipity?" It has been voted one of the ten English words hardest to translate in June 2004 by a British translation company. Basically, "serendipity" refers to "looking for one thing and **stumbling over** something else that proves to be of greater value." The word was coined by Horace Walpole, a 18th-centure English writer. In a letter he wrote to a friend, Walpole explained an unexpected discovery he had made by reference to a Persian fairy tale, "The Three Princes of Serendip." The princes made discoveries through accidents, and they turned disasters into triumphs. Serendip, by the way, is the old Persian name for what is now Sri Lanka, aka Ceylon. While this may be a new word to many of us, we have in fact all benefited from inventions of this nature in our daily life. Penicillin, for instance, was created out of an accident. In fact, serendipity has always played an essential role in the human history, particularly that of scientific inventions or discoveries.

On that day, all the people on the island – tourists included – are expected to stay at their places, quietly meditate and reflect upon what they have done in the previous year. Isn't it cool?
